Narrabri Golf Club hosts annual

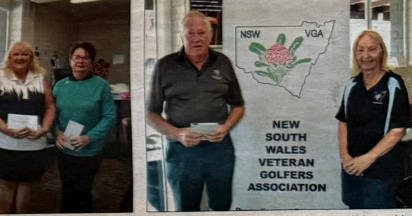
